Aboriginal Cultural Experience (ACE) Camp



A FREE day camp program for Aboriginal: Métis, Inuit & First Nations Students entering grade 7 or 8 from Vancouver School District

Students will be supervised the entire day by (6) UNYA staff. They will receive nutritional morning snacks and healthy lunch each day. The goal of this program is to expose students to a creative process where they will learn hands on skills and acquire cultural experience through many art forms including, Visual Art, Drama, Storytelling, Creative Writing, Dance and Media Art. By the fourth week students will perform their play three times at a community location for parents and community members including a feast and awards presentation on the last day of program.
